Here's a Christmas present Mom will love, and you can be really proud of!



**1 WHAT YOU'LL NEED**



**2 CUT OUT THE PIECES**

We have quite a bit of sawing to do on this project.

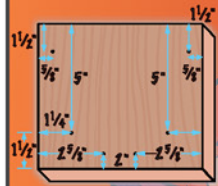
So I see.

No, you saw.



**3 MARK & DRILL**

Use the drawing below to carefully mark the end pieces for drilling. Have an adult drill the holes for you. Then sand the edges until smooth.



If we played connect-the-dots, we'd have a big smile.



**6. WRAP & GIVE**  
It's a great present.

**5. SAND, PAINT, STAIN OR FINISH**  
Use your imagination!

**1. CUT** as shown

**4 ROUND THE CORNERS and sand them smooth**

**2. MARK & DRILL**  
Have an adult help drill the holes as shown in the diagram. Measure carefully.

**3. ATTACH BOTTOM**  
lining up the center marks on the bottom and ends.

**4. ATTACH SIDES**  
lining up the bottoms and the edges (see illustration below.)

**7 SAND & FINISH**

You can stain it to match the other furniture in the house. You might also want to paint it, or even cover it with pictures and a clear protective finish.

I like using these tools!  
The coping saw?

Yes. And the can of soda pop!

Use a soda can to trace a rounded corner.

Did I hear soda?

**5 ATTACH BOTTOM**

Now it's starting to come together! Where's Woody?



He mentioned something about a soda.

Mark the center of both the end pieces and the bottom piece, and attach with screws as shown. Line them up carefully and attach one end to the bottom, and then the other.

**6 ATTACH SIDES**

Getting all this lined up can be tricky. Thanks for lending a hand, Pops.

No problem. I'll lend you both - and throw in an arm.

Line up the bottom edge of the big side piece even with the bottom edge of the end piece. Repeat both of these steps for the other side.

Mom will love this for her magazines!

Mom will love mine too! It's for Pop's magazines.



Another option is to attach the bottom with nails, and use smaller screws to attach the sides. Fill the nail holes with wood filler and sand before finishing.
